7th Annual Firefighters' Car & Motorcycle Show Once Again Attracts Many Classic Vehicles

It had been suggested last year that there should be more judging classifications to allow the judges some flexibility in selecting the best looking vehicles. So, this year, the organizers obliged by setting up 12 different entry categories for consideration.

The "Extramen" Giving Program

You Could Receive A Handsome Set of Seven Lapel Pins and Case

The elegant collection of lapel pins shown in the above photo could be yours.

"How?" you may ask. Read on.

Each pin represents a donation level in the San Jose Fire Museum's "Institution of the Extramen" giving program. As you begin to donate to the Museum's efforts to preserve the history of the San Jose Fire Department, you will receive a pin for each level as you progress up the rankings.

Now, you may wonder, "What is the significance of the program's name?"

When the San Jose Fire Department created a 30-man paid force in the 1870s, professional or not, they could not handle the workload of its original volunteer force. The institution of the paid volunteer or "extraman" was created to fill the gap. As a civilian with his own full-time employment, the extraman was assigned to respond to fires with a particular company whenever the alarm sounded. For this, he was paid a nominal salary.

The SJFM Board of Directors decided to use this institution as the official means of receiving donations from active and retired San Jose firefighters. This program recognizes their support in saving and preserving the history, apparatus and memorabilia of the San Jose Fire Department.

So, now you may ask, "OK. So what are the donation levels and has anyone qualified?"

The information in the list to the right identifies the donation levels for each Extramen rank and is accurate through the end of December, 2011. Many of the individuals who have met the initial Extramen criteria have already received their Extramen pin.

In the next couple of months, the individuals listed will receive their Extramen Pin Collection Case with a pin for each level they have achieved.

And, to this elite group of Extramen, we have added over 30 more names so far in 2012! We will report out everyone's name in our Fall newsletter.

The SJFM Board of Directors thanks everyone who has stepped up after we announced in the Spring newsletter that we needed our donation base to grow.

Now, in order for our non-profit to make a positive impression on potential major partners from the private sector, we need your support, too.

With that being said, we have a new Board member to announce. SJFD Firefighter Mike Igno has stepped up to the plate and taken over for Fire Captain Jerry Durk. Durk's position on the Board was as Special Operations Officer. I want to thank Jerry for his time on the Board. He has been our Special Operations Officer for over 4 years and has done a great job. It is the duty of the Special Operations Officer to organize and plan for the Museum's presence at events all over the city. Jerry also was involved in many other aspects of the Museum and we will miss him.

This is not a "good-bye", however, as we expect that Jerry will be involved with us again, as his time allows. If you see Jerry, please thank him for his contributions to save our Department's history. In the meantime, Mike has already jumped into his new role and is doing a great job - with the advice and guidance of others.

On the apparatus front, the SJFM made an offer on a 1914 Knox Chemical Fire Engine that had been privately owned. We officially purchased it in early June for a sum of \$5,000. Today, it is being evaluated by the volunteer workers at the Restoration Shop, located at History Park San Jose. This is the same crew of dedicated men who recently restored our 1928 White Manufacturing aerial tractor.

We know that the Knox started out with the Berkeley Fire Department and later served the La Selva Beach Fire Department. Originally, it had a Knox motor and chain drive similar to our own Knox Martin Tricycle. Sometime around 1929, it was converted to a direct drive shaft and received a Hall-Scott motor.

The great news is that we know of a privately owned twin to this rig that was also a part of Berkeley Fire - and, it went through the same engine conversion. Our goal is to work with the owner of this twin engine and restore both of the vehicles to a similar condition.

Finally, a big "Thank You" to everyone who helps with our goal to create a down-town Fire Museum!


A string of classic hot rods were just some of the vehicles that lined the streets at History Park.
